We are forever indebted to our change driver, Nancy Mbaura, whose continued quest for knowledge will benefit us in the long run.

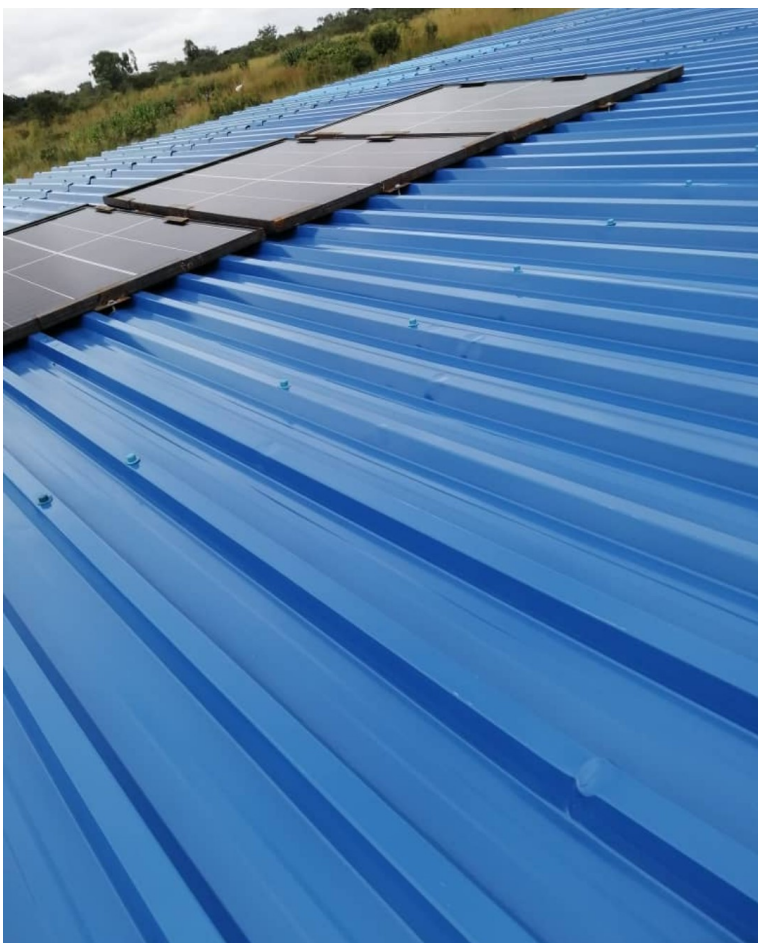
